

**ORDER NO. 2020-1-J**

**TENTH AMENDED ORDER OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF RIO GRANDE CITY REVISING SEVERAL EMERGENCY MEASURES PREVIOUSLY RECORDED IN ORDER NO. 2020-1-I, EXTENDING THE CITY'S DISASTER DECLARATION AND EXISTING EMERGENCY MEASURES ORDER UNTIL OCTOBER 31, 2020, PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Rio Grande City Commission's Disaster Declaration and Emergency Measures Order were set to expire on September 30, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Rio Grande City Commission has determined that it is reasonable and necessary to extend the Disaster Declaration until October 31, 2020 and maintain the Emergency Measures Order previously adopted, remaining effective until October 31, 2020.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, MAYOR OF THE CITY OF RIO GRANDE CITY, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED BY TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE CHAPTER 418, HEREBY FIND AND ORDER:**

**Section 1.** This Disaster Declaration and Emergency Measures Order (which is made available upon request with the City Secretary) shall remain effective until **October 31, 2020**, unless otherwise terminated or renewed earlier by the City of Rio Grande City – City Commission.

**Section 2.** If any subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Order or application of it to any person, structure, gathering or circumstance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, then such decision will not affect the validity of the rest of the order that can be given the effect without the invalid provision, and to this end, the provisions of this Order are severable.
